Dear Sir:-

I beg to advise that the following resolution was passed by Council last evening in reference to conditions of employment with the City, namely:-

"WHEREAS a Board of Conciliation and Investigation established by the Minister of Labor under the Industrial Disputes Investigation Act to deal with differences between Hydro Electric System of the Corporation of the City of Winnipeg and certain of its employees being linemen and cable splicers; the matter in dispute relating to certain conditions of employment prohibiting such employees from becoming associated with any other labor union; said Board of Conciliation and Investigation has made its report and a copy of the findings and recommendations of the said Board having been submitted to the City, and whereas it is deemed advisable and in the best interests of the City to accept the unanimous recommendation of the said Board, and to adjust the matter in dispute in accordance therewith, and also to give effect to the principle underlying such recommendation.

"BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the obligation heretofore required by the City from the Workers in its employ with reference to membership in Unions or Trade Associations be no longer insisted upon from any employee."
