

COPY OF RESOLUTION

(1) Resolved, that this Committee is opposed to the principle of sympathetic strikes by employees in public utilities departments of public service and those which affect the distribution of milk and food.

(2) That no employees who are members of Unions having affiliation with any outside organizations which purport to exercise authority over the employees in relation to their actions towards their employers should be employed or retained in the City Police Department, Fire Department, Water Works Department, City Light and Power Department, Government Telephones or Postal Service.

(3) That this committee, however, recognizes the right of any such employees as so desire to form unions or associations among themselves and to bargain with their employers as to wages and working conditions through their committees without interference whatever by an outside body which may affect their allegiance to their employers and the position of trust which they occupy towards the public, and also the right in the case of disagreement to appeal to a duly constituted board or authority.
