1918. Strike of Teamsters lasted from May 7th to May 25th (incl.) During this time the horses were resting, & the feed etc., for that period amounted to \$1465.10. This item being charged against Scavenging, accounts for the higher costs of loads and tonnage for May, 1918. The new schedule of wages is also included.

1919. Strike of Teamsters began May 15th 11 a.m., and continued through May. During this time the horses were resting & the feed, etc., for that period amounted to \$1,122.00. This item being charged against Scavenging accounts for the higher costs of loads and tonnage for May, 1919. The new schedule of wages is also included.
