Members of the Department are hereby advised that the Winnipeg Board of Police Commissioners at a meeting held on May 11th 1917 passed the following resolution: This Board of Police Commissioners hereby adopts the following pelicySithat having regard to the best interests of the City of Winnipeg and its citizens, no union or association allied to any other body whatscever be permitted to be organized amongst members of the Police Department.
