THAT the Municipality of Transcona has never had any trouble with its employees in the matter of strikes and the Council cannot see its way to endorse your resolution.

Transcona council is of the opinion that if, instead of pressing for legislation of a coercive nature which would take away the rights of free citizens from their employees, if Municipal councils would use their influence to have all workers given a living wage, the high cost of living reduced, and ruthless profiteers punished, they would be doing more towards prevention of Sympathetic Strikes, or indeed strikes of any description, and would at the same time be best serving the interests of the communities which they represent.
